

GENERAL NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

- 1. There are no class entry fees and no prize monies. First, second and third cards, cups and trophies will be awarded as usual.
- 2. All classes are open i.e. entrants do not have to be resident in Tattenhall.
- 3. Entry forms will be accepted between 9.00am and 11.30am on the day of the show at the Barbour Institute.
- 4. All exhibits to be staged between 9.00am and 12 noon. At 12 noon the hall will be cleared for judging.
- 5. There is a maximum of three entries per exhibitor in each class.
- 6. Exhibits in sections A, B, C and D must have been grown by the exhibitor or have been cultivated by the exhibitor for at least the three months prior to the show. Uniformity and the same variety of specimens score higher in judging.
- 7. Entries in sections E, F, G, H, I and J are to be the exhibitor's own work.
- 8. Wherever possible, exhibitors are encouraged to display the name of the variety of fruit, vegetable, flower or plant being exhibited.
- 9. Exhibitors must provide their own vases, dishes etc. (except for class 11, where small containers are provided for exhibitors).
- 10. All exhibits are entered at the exhibitor's own risk.
- 11. If there are three or fewer entries in any class, the judges reserve the right to combine classes.
- 12. In all classes, if exhibits are considered not up to standard, the granting of an award will be left to the judge's discretion.
- 13. In all cases the judge's decision will be final.
- 14. Names of best in section winners and most points in section winners will be displayed on the stage during the afternoon.
- 15. Trophies may be collected from the stage after 3.30pm.
- 16. Trophies and cups are to be held for one year and must not be engraved.
- 17. No exhibits may be removed before 4pm.

Specific notes and guidance are provided alongside each section

BARBOUR CLEGG CUP

will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in the show

BROSTER CUP

will be awarded to the exhibitor with the second highest number of points in the show

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

SECTION A - FLOWERS

- 1. 1 specimen rose please display rose name on a card
- 2. 1 multi-headed or multi-stemmed rose
- 3. 1 Hydrangea head
- 4. Vase of 5 Dahlias
- 5. 3 ornamental grass seed heads (one variety)
- 6. 1 seed head
- 7. Vase of mixed garden flowers (may include annuals, perennials or shrubs)
- 8. Vase of annuals, one variety
- 9. Vase of mixed foliage or berries
- 10. 3 stems of any plant / shrub in flower one variety not already included in the schedule
- 11. 6 Fuchsia flowers (containers will be provided)
- 12. Vase of Sweet Peas
- 13. 3 Hosta leaves (one variety)
- 14. 5 stems of foliage

SECTION A NOTES

The **Flower Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section A.

SECTION B – VEGETABLES

- 15. 5 tomatoes
- 16. 5 red cherry tomatoes (inc. Gardener's Delight)
- 17. 5 cherry tomatoes of any other colour
- 18. 5 runner beans
- 19. 5 French beans
- 20. 5 potatoes named
- 21. 3 onions grown from sets (heat treated or otherwise)
- 22. Bunch of 5 herbs suitable for use in cooking (in water)
- 23. Heaviest marrow or courgette
- 24. 3 courgettes
- 25. 3 sweet or chilli peppers
- 26. 1 cucumber
- 27. Collection of 3 different salad items
- 28. Any other variety of vegetable not already in the schedule
- 29. 5 specimen vegetables (one each of five different varieties)

SECTION B NOTES

The **Brockelsby Salver** will be awarded for the best entry in section B.

Classes 15-21, 24 and 25 to be all of the same variety.

SECTION C - FRUIT

- 30. 5 cooking apples
- 31. 5 eating apples
- 32. 5 pears
- 33. 5 plums or damsons
- 34. Dish of soft fruit one variety
- 35. Any other fruit not already in the schedule (including ornamental fruits)

SECTION C NOTES

The **Fruit Bowl Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section C.

All fruit in each class to be of the same variety.

SECTION D - POT PLANTS & MISCELLANEOUS

- 36. Any plant in bloom in pot up to 5" (12.5 cm)
- 37. Any plant in bloom in pot over 5" (12.5 cm)
- 38. Foliage plant
- 39. 1 specimen Cactus or succulent
- 40. A Fuchsia
- 41. Any exotic flower or flowering plant
- 42. Orchid in a pot
- 43. An amusing / peculiar flower, vegetable or fruit

SECTION D NOTES

The **Pot Plant Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section D.

SECTION E - COOKERY

- 44. Three blondies
- 45. Bread three rolls or a loaf
- 46. Any cake highly decorated
- 47. Three cupcakes
- 48. Three savoury scones
- 49. A 'free from' cake
- 50. Three muffins

SECTION E NOTES

The **Cookery Plate Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section E.

Class 49: own recipe, to be labelled with the relevant allergen(s) avoided.

SECTION F - CREATIVE FLOWERS

- 51. A jam jar of weeds or wildflowers
- 52. Five stems of flowers of one variety (from home or from the supermarket!) made to look interesting
- 53. Flowers arranged in a jug or vase

SECTION F NOTES

The **Floral Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section F.

Flowers for all classes in section F do not have to be home grown.

Please do not use oasis floral foam in order to protect the environment.

SPECIAL CLASS

"Tattenhall Talent"

An exhibit to represent your organization or business.

These exhibits are not part of the classes that are judged – the winner will be decided by public vote during the afternoon.

There are no technical rules for this class but wit, ingenuity and humour are all good ideas.

The Special Class will be judged by public vote during the afternoon.

Special Class entries not to exceed 24" (60 cm) in width or depth.

SECTION G - CRAFTS

- 54. A piece of hand needlecraft (e.g. embroidery, patchwork, cross-stitch, tapestry, quilting)
- 55. A piece of machine sewing or embroidery
- 56. A hand knitted or crocheted item
- 57. A piece of jewellery or bead craft
- 58. A hand made greetings card (not from a kit)
- 59. A craft of your own choice not already in the schedule
- 60. An upcycled item
- 61. Entry for ages 12 to 16 An upcycled fashion item supported by Ditzy Rose Makery

SECTION G NOTES

The **Craft Plate Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in section G.

SECTION H – PHOTOGRAPHY

- 62. Landscape or waterscape
- 63. Plants, flowers or a garden scene
- 64. Buildings
- 65. People to include children, adults, portraits etc.
- 66. Animal life other than people
- 67. Sporting Action
- 68. Abstract
- 69. Wildlife (animals, insects, flowers, fungi etc.) seen in Tattenhall Parish
- 70. General to include anything else

SECTION H NOTES

The **Millennium Cup** will be awarded to the best entry in section H.

Signatures / identification marks must be covered over.

Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Tattenhall Annual Show and must be the exhibitor's original work.

Print size not to exceed $12" \times 10" (30 \times 25.4 cm)$.

All entries to be securely mounted on card. Please write your name & the class number (e.g. "64" for a Buildings entry) on the **back** of the card.

SECTION I - ART

- 71. A landscape, townscape or waterscape
- 72. Plants, flowers or a garden scene
- 73. People (including portraits) and/or animals
- 74. Any other painting, drawing or mixed media (including abstract)
- 75. Any other art form (e.g. sculpture, pottery etc. but not a painting or drawing)
- 76. Print of an original digital artwork

The **Art Trophy** will be awarded to the best entry in Section I.

Classes 71 to 75 may be in any medium.

Exhibits must be an original artwork and must not have been entered in a previous Tattenhall Annual Show. Signatures on exhibits must be covered over.

For classes 71 to 74 please write your name and the class number (e.g. "73" for a People entry) on the back of the exhibit.

SECTION J - CHILDREN

a) Children aged 7 or under

- 79. An elf or fairy door that opens
- 80. Something you have made (not from a kit)
- 81. A photograph of a family pet

b) Children aged 8 to 11

Prizes will be awarded for:

- best entry in section J(a);
- best entry in section J(b); and
